

Watkins Glen Downtown Vision

The vision of the Watkins Glen Downtown Revitalization
Initiative is to leverage the accessible Seneca Lake waterfront,
famous wine trails, vibrant arts scene, internationally
recognized racetrack with a storied auto-racing heritage, and
world class State Park for progressive community development
that retains and enhances our unique character to sustain a
year-round innovative and prosperous economy that is
supported by our community.

Vision statement was created for the DRI Application based on public input and prior planning work in the Village.

Watkins Glen Downtown Goals

Goal 1: Downtown Living

Build on the strong sense of place in Watkins Glen by increasing walkability, providing a range of housing types, and promoting downtown as a mixed-use district.

Goal 2: Culture & Entertainment

Create an active, year-round downtown environment for residents and visitors by supporting arts and cultural organizations, nightlife, youth-oriented activities, and regular events.

Goal 3: Economic Development

Attract high-paying jobs, skilled workers, and young professionals by promoting year-round local-based businesses and investment in infrastructure.

Goal 4: Quality of Life

Promote Watkins Glen's identity as a vibrant community for residents, businesses, and visitors.

Open Call for DRI Projects

The Watkins Glen DRI Local Planning Committee is seeking proposals for potential DRI projects on private property.

- Objective is to hear from the community about potential projects on private sites.
- LPC wants to ensure that any DRI funding for a project on private property is fully vetted out in the open.
- Deadline to submit will be in late November so the LPC can review submissions before presenting at the next public workshop.
- Types of projects could include: new construction and renovation of existing buildings

Project Selection Criteria

Projects recommended for funding can include:

- Public and private construction or rehabilitation.
- Legislative and regulatory recommendations.
- Branding and marketing.
- Grant/loan programs for businesses and residents.

The DRI Plan may include:

- Priority Projects that are candidates for DRI funding.
- Other projects and actions that support the Village's vision but could receive funding from other sources.

Project Selection Criteria

Cost

Estimated cost to public and private sector partners and operating costs.

Community benefit

Potential tax revenue impacts and anticipated community benefits.

Catalytic potential

 Potential to transform downtown, leverage additional funding, make a longterm impact.

Job generation

Estimated employment and workforce development potential.


Feasibility

Capacity to implement, project readiness, site control, regulatory challenges.

Public support

 Demonstration of support based on Public Engagement Events and prior planning.

Goal 1: Downtown Living

New Project Ideas:

- Extend Village water service to Salt Point.
- Reduce stormwater runoff in downtown.
- Pocket parks and community gardens in downtown.
- Redevelop Carriage House.
- Reduce truck traffic and noise.
- Improved wayfinding signage.
- More street trees.
- Pre-school/youth facility in new development.
- Upgrade water and sewer lines to accommodate new development.

New Project Ideas:

- Salt History Museum.
- YMCA or family resource centers, activities, childcare.
- Children's sports leagues (e.g., gymnastics, ice hockey, soccer, etc.)
- Indoor sports/gym activity center or large communal art space.
- Clute Park: outdoor theater, dog park, concert/performance series.
- Bike rental.
- Relocate racing museum to Franklin.
- Downtown museum for geology, viticulture, Native American heritage, racing heritage, the Finger Lakes, fish and boating, etc.
- Ice climbing facility.
- Collaboration with Corning Museum of Glass.
- Village-wide WIFI and broadband.
- Seneca Lake Winery Heritage Center.
- Educational Collaboration with FLCC/CCC.

Goal 3: Economic Development

New Project Ideas:

- Test kitchen with pop-up restaurant space, cooking/wine classes.
- Maker space with 3D printers, electronics development, and shop equipment.
- Grants or loans to develop small businesses on Decatur.
- Property tax abatement to encourage property owners to improve property.
- Activity space to bring young families downtown.
- Co-working facility at the carriage house.
- Cornell Viticulture/FLCC satellite location.
- Program to assist retail owners with operations (i.e., Gordon Ramsey Restaurant Makeovers).
- Fill vacant storefronts.
- Retail Boot Camp to transform businesses with help merchandising/branding.
- Hemp Research Institute.
- New façade/redevelop Ferry House (475 N. Franklin).

Goal 4: Quality of Life

New Project Ideas:

- Improve façade of the salt plant.
- Alternative Health & Wellness Center.
- Salt Plant hiking trail from Cargill to US Salt with scenic overlook.
- Community Garden at Clute Park.
- Signage for Village/Service organizations.
- More trees and landscaping.
- Public artwork—not just murals; interactive pieces, partner with other underrepresented agencies; rotating art and visiting artists.
- Parking management to resolve parking issues.
- Broadband.
- Public garden at Clute Park to showcase native plants, bushes, seasonal flowers, etc.
